The prayer list does not contain specific health information. It is the church's policy to respect people's privacy and also in compliance with the Hippa Act.

# Health Ministry of Living Grace

January brings many opportunities to make fresh starts, and in addition we also recognize Sanctity of Life Sunday. This month I would like to share some thoughts with you about End of Life Health Care Decisions.

## Why Consider End of Life Decisions?

Approximately 90% of Americans will die a “managed death” and have the opportunity (or burden) to make decisions about how long they will live and under what conditions. Patients can make such decisions through the use of Advanced Directives (a statement of your health care choices or naming someone to make decisions for you). Those who have not signed an advanced directive or living will place the burden of making decisions on loved ones.

## What Principles Should Guide Health Care Decisions?

Decisions about health care, like our other life decisions should be based on Biblical truths. The following principles may be useful in guiding our health care decisions and are adapted from Christian Care at Life’s End.

- Each person is created in God’s image and deserves to be treated with the same standard of care (regardless of age or infirmity).
- As Creator, God alone knows with certainty if a condition is incurable.
- When God given body functions to sustain life are no longer effective and the doctors’ judgment is that there is no real hope for recovery, a Christian may in good conscience, let nature take its course.
- Providing pain-relieving medications, even at risk of shortening life, is permissible, since this does not involve the choice of death over life.

- When suffering intrudes into life it provides the opportunity for Christian witness and service.
- It is good ethical practice for doctors to receive a statement signed by the patient indicating wishes to end life-sustaining treatment in case of a terminal condition.
- Death is not only a physical event, but a crucial emotional and spiritual experience for each person.
- Euthanasia in its proper sense involves suicide/murder. It is therefore contrary to God’s will.
- Any complex health care decision and related actions that later appear to be misguided, have been redeemed by Christ.

If you have any questions or concerns related to health care decision, please contact me. We have extra, copies of Advanced Care Directives in the narthex.

My wish for each of you is a blessed, healthy new year, using your God given gifts to be of service to one another.
