### *Scriptural Journey of Baptism Affirmation*

Even though we witness the baptismal rite on a regular basis during worship services throughout the year, we rarely have the opportunity to internalize, personalize, and reflect on how this sacrament works within us. A Scriptural Journey of Baptism Affirmation offers the worshiper the opportunity to reconnect with the symbols and meaning of the initiation rite of Holy Baptism. In the course of this one-hour service, we will participate in a faith pilgrimage that includes sung biblical narratives, silence, spoken and silent prayers, and hands-on activities with baptismal symbols. The elimination of excess verbiage allows the symbols to speak for themselves. Through this service we will take ownership of our baptismal vows that will hopefully inspire us to incorporate our baptismal vows into daily devotional practice.

## Health Ministry

May we all be strengthened as we recognize our calling as Saints of God. This theme is especially on my mind as November begins with the Festival of All Saint's Day. November is also recognized as *National Hospice Month*. We live our days as God's saints, with the precious assurance of living our eternity with Him and all of our brothers and sisters in Christ. This understanding helps us to better understand the nature of our life as well as our death.

These words also give us hope when we or a loved one is dying. It is important to remember that Jesus has conquered death and the grave, but that sickness, suffering and death are very real and difficult experiences for us. Persons who are dying often experience **five different reactions to dying**.

**Denial or disbelief** is a first reaction. People may say such things as, "This isn't happening to me" or "They must have made a mistake with the lab results." At first, denial is helpful, because it protects the person from a painful reality. If it persists for weeks or months, it stops the person from experiencing acceptance and peace as they face their death.

**Anger** is a second reaction. People may say such things as "Why do I have to die?" They may direct their anger at family members, health care providers or others. This reaction is important because it allows the person to come face to face with their painful reality. When people do not allow themselves to experience anger, this may actually interfere with their experience of real peace.

**Bargaining** is a third reaction many people experience. People may try to make deals with God or others in exchange for a longer life. This reaction is very personal and spiritual, so many people do not share it openly with others. Some people may come to acceptance without going through bargaining.

**Depression** is a fourth reaction to dying. People may have a sad and gloomy mood. They often feel hopeless and helpless, as well as anxious and fearful. It may be difficult for them to relate to others, sleep, and eat. This reaction helps the person understand the full depth of the loss of their life, as well as all the other losses they have experienced.

**Acceptance** is a fifth reaction people can experience. In acceptance, people face the reality of their impending death and experience peace and wholeness. People may say such things as ". . . Well, I've been thinking a lot about my death, and I

feel ready to go to God.” People who experience acceptance need support just like persons with any of the other reactions to dying.

St. Paul speaks to us in these words, “. . . if only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are to be pitied more than all men” (1 Cor. 15:19). Jesus is present and helps us in every way in our living and in our dying. May we share this hope and comfort as we minister to one another.

He is currently a PhD candidate at the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago. Born in Montego Bay, Jamaica, Nunes grew up in Hamilton, Ontario, Canada, and has lived in the U.S. since 1981. He lives in Baltimore, Maryland with his wife, Monique, who is the principal of Baltimore Lutheran School, and his son, John, Jr. (15), the youngest of their five children.

**Images of the Season**  
**All Saints Sunday – 7 November**

In holy baptism God makes saints out of sinners. In holy communion God forgives the sins of all the saints. In the service on 7 November, we give thanks for all the saints “who from their labors rest,” who have fought the good fight, who have gained the crown. In the same breath we petition our God for the strength to hear and to heed the admonitions of the Lord Jesus in the gospel. Recalling that we have been sealed by the Spirit and sustained by the Savior’s body and blood, we keep on keeping on as God gives us breath, to the praise of God’s glory.

On this day, we will have a special service at 4:00 p.m. on Affirmation of Baptism. This will be a wonderful experience.

**First Sunday of Advent – 28 November**

The new church year begins with a wake-up call: Christ is coming soon! However, we do not know neither the day nor hour of the Lord’s coming. Isaiah proclaims the day when God will gather all people on the holy mountain and there will be no more war or suffering. Though we vigilantly watch for the promised day of salvation, we wait for what we already have: Christ comes among us this day as the word and meal that strengthens our faith in the promises of God.

In the season of Advent, there will be changes in the liturgy. We omit the Hymn of Praise and we will be using Setting Five. We also start in the Year of Matthew. The gospel lessons will come from the gospel of Matthew.

**Thanksgiving Eve Service**
