“I went down to the grove of walnut trees and out to the valley to see the new spring growth, to see whether the grapevines had budded or the pomegranates were in bloom.”

Song of Solomon 6:11

Spring gives us such a pleasure as we see everything coming back to life, and it is a reminder of the new life that we have through Christ’s resurrection. Gardening is a pleasure for most of us, but is also an exercise that can lead to injuries. Raking, mulching, planting, trimming and digging are good physical activity yet can result in pain and stiffness in our neck, shoulder, elbow, wrist, knees and back if we over-extend ourselves. To enjoy the flowers, vegetables and fruits without pain try these tips from Dr. William Madosky, a St. Louis chiropractor.

- **Treat gardening as a sport:** Warm up and stretch the muscles before beginning.
- **Be realistic:** Plan your work carefully to avoid injury. Set a moderate pace and time schedule to allow enjoyment of the task and minimize potential injuries.
- **Remember good body mechanics:** When lifting heavy bags of dirt or mulch, keep your back straight, bend your knees, lift with the legs, and hold objects close to your body. If shoveling, lift the dirt and lift the entire body to empty it—don’t twist.
- **Change it up:** Use different muscle groups and minimize the repetitive stress placed on joints and extremities by frequently changing activities.
- **Use a cushion, stool, or small bench when weeding:** The support helps reduce stress placed on knees and spine for gardening movements.
- **Take frequent breaks:** By stopping to stretch, getting a drink or just enjoying the progress every half hour, you minimize your chance of injury or dehydration.
- **Stop gardening if fatigued or in pain:** That “one last thing” when tired leads to injury. If pain occurs, stop! If pain persists, apply ice to the affected area for 15-20 minutes at a time to reduce inflammation. **DO NOT USE HEAT**—it increases the inflammatory process. If pain persists, contact the doctor.

We can spend time in the garden appreciating the glory of God’s creation, while caring for our body at the same time.

The Rev. Mark S. Hanson, presiding bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), said his appointment to a presidential advisory committee strongly affirms the involvement of ELCA members "in serving our neighbors."



Good Shepherd in Woodstock, GA, has been selected as one of 10 congregations (out of 110 nominees) to partner with Luther Seminary to commit to a process of experimental learning designed to transform congregational cultures so that engagement with God's Word is broad and deep. This learning is centered in an Action Reflection Team (ART) co-chaired by Pastor Justin Ask and Associate in Ministry Michelle Angalet. Together, the teams work to build congregational capacity for equipping lay people to engage with the Scriptures. The learning is supported by three consultations at Luther Seminary, wherein team co-chairs gather to compare notes and deepen their understanding of the discernment process in consultation with Luther Seminary faculty and staff. Over the next 18 months Good Shepherd will partner with Luther and the other participating congregations to form a learning community dedicated to articulating and enhancing the concrete linkages between Biblical fluency and congregational vitality. Members of the Good Shepherd ART are Lori Adams, Susan Epling, Chuck McCoy, Tammy Olsen, and Ed Roberts.

Luther Seminary covers all costs involved, including all travel expenses for the action reflection team co-chairs to travel to Luther over the course of the project. Good Shepherd looks forward to sharing this experience with other congregations around the Synod in the months ahead! Curious to find out more? Sunday of the Passion/Palm Sunday – 17 April

In today's liturgy, we will begin with a palm procession, commemorating Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Quickly the tone of the service changes as we meditate upon Jesus' passion and death. Because this story is so central to our faith, we hear Matthew's account of the passion on

this day and John's version on Good Friday. Though Jesus is obedient even unto death on the cross, he is exalted by God. We gather to remember his offering for life of the world, and to be fed by his life-giving mercy. Holy Week will culminate in the celebration of the Three Days of Jesus' suffering, death and resurrection.

Maundy Thursday – 21 April

With nightfall our Lenten observance comes to an end, and we gather with Christians around the world to celebrate the *Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection*. At the heart of the Maundy Thursday liturgy is Jesus' commandment to love one another. As Jesus washed the feet of his disciples, we are called to follow his example as we humbly care for one another, especially the poor and the unloved. At the Lord's table we remember Jesus' sacrifice of his life, even as we are called to offer ourselves in love for the life of the world.

Good Friday – 22 April

At the heart of the Good Friday liturgy is the passion according to John, which proclaims Jesus as a triumphant king who reigns from the cross. The ancient title for this day—the triumph of the cross—reminds us that the church gathers not to mourn this day but to celebrate Christ's life-giving passion and to find strength and hope in the tree of life.

All these services are connected and lead up to the *Day the Lord has acted! The Resurrection of Our Lord*. With great joy we celebrate this day of days, even as we begin the great *fifty* days of Easter!

The Senior Choir rehearses on Wednesdays, 7:00 p.m. – 8:30 p.m. All adults and older teens are welcome to come and sing. The Senior Choir normally sings at the 10:30 a.m. worship service. For more information, please contact Ken Sass, Director of Music.

The Handbell Choir rehearses on Sundays after the 10:30 a.m. services. The April rehearsal dates are Sundays, 3rd and 17th, at 12 noon.
